DON'T FORGET ABOUT LOCATION

Nursing Home Interview and Tour

Administrator & Director of Nursing

- Staff ratios
- Staff training- elderly specific
- Medical doctor
- Attending physicians (investigate)- especially if this will be a "new doctor" for resident
- Surveys & Complaints- #, severity, timing

Tour

- Forget the lobby
- Hygiene- physical & residents
- Talk to staff
- Watch, listen and learn

DON'T FORGET ABOUT LOCATION

Nursing Home Responsibilities & Resident's Rights

 Nursing STD of Care- STD's that "nurses" in geriatric/NH/custodial care settings must follow-"Nursing 101"

AND

- Federal & State Regs- elaborate scheme mandating care to protect NH residents from most common preventable injuries
 - Pressure ulcers
 - Falls
 - Malnutrition & dehydration

"Nursing Home Bill of Rights" (N.J.S.A 30:13-1, et seq.)

- NH Responsibilities Care complying with:
 - Federal/State Regulations
 - State Law
 - Much More
- Resident's Rights
 - Dignified care & treatment (ADLs)
 - And More
- Minimum Standards of Care
 - "Floor, not a ceiling."

Why Nursing Homes Fail

- Lower Level Staff
- Inadequate training
- Too many residents
- Lack of supervision
- Shouldn't have admitted resident at all

Warning Signs of Nursing Home Abuse & Neglect

- Lack of nursing care/attention
 - Pressure ulcers
 - Fractures
 - Falls (fx, head injury, etc.)
 - Dehydration/malnutrition/weight loss
 - Infection
 - Acute kidney failure

INJURIES - NOT MEDICAL CONDITIONS

Litigating the Case

- Intense Investigation
- Complaint
- Common law
- Statutory
- Fact Discovery
 - Written- Chart, Policies & Procedures, Financial
 - Depositions- Testimony from every level of care
- Expert Discovery
 - Geriatrician
 - Nurse
 - Injury specific expert (e.g. Infectious disease, WCN)

Types of Damages

- Pain & Suffering
 - Physical
 - Emotional
 - Loss of dignity
- Consortium
- Wrongful Death
 - Advice, companionship and guidance
 - Funeral bills
 - Unpaid medical expenses
 - Additional Economic Loss

- Average \$250,000- \$300,000
- Traumatic Injury vs. Systemic Failure Cases

- Fee and Cost Shifting Issues
